THE CENTENARY GALA DINNER – AN EVENING TO CELEBRATE

December 2015 was a memorable celebratory month for us St. Paulians. On 14 December 2015, I was part of the SPCC Alumni Choir which performed in the SPCC Centenary Concert at the Hong Kong Cultural Centre. The world premiere of the special choral piece, *Faith Hope and Love – A Choral Triptych*, written by renowned composer Mark Hayes, brought together the primary school and secondary school choirs, the Alumni Choir and the two school orchestras. The two encore songs, conducted by SPCC Music Director Warren Lee (1994), lifted the evening to a new height and

ended on a most memorable note. The experience was simply exhilarating, and at the end of the performance, we members of the Alumni Choir and all our fellow student choir members applauded each other at the same time, sharing a special moment to celebrate our unity and the joy of music.

On 20 December 2015 was the much-anticipated Centenary Gala Dinner, which was the largest dinner ever held in the history of our school. There were close to 300 tables at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre (HKCEC),

attended by distinguished guests, Council members, alumni, students, current and former teachers and parents.

While the Centenary Gala Dinner was funded by the School Council, the SPCC Alumni Association was very honoured to be tasked with the organising of this important event. Planning for this mega dinner began 20 months ago in mid-2014 with the Alumni Association appointing Class Coordinators to help reach out to our alumni. Since we would want as many alumni as possible to attend, we decided that all the dinner bookings were not made on a first-come-first-served basis, but rather placed through each graduation year's Class Coordinators.

The support and response from alumni were so overwhelming that, to avoid disappointment, the Gala Dinner Organising Committee decided to hire a second banquet hall at the HKCEC in early 2015. With great networking effort from the Class Coordinators, we had alumni tables from 1951

to 2015, spanning 65 years. We felt so blessed that many overseas alumni specially made the trip back to attend the Centenary Concert and Centenary Gala Dinner.

The Dinner seating plan for alumni was arranged according to seniority. Those in the Convention Hall (old wing) were from Class 1951 to 1978, while those in the new wing Grand Hall were from Class 1979 to 2015. Both halls were hosted by School Council members.



During the reception, which began at 6:00 pm, the SPCC Chamber Ensemble welcomed all the guests with their lively musical performance in the Convention Foyer. Soon, the reception was crowded with guests, many queuing at various photo booths, browsing the centenary souvenirs or mingling and reminiscing with classmates, teachers and friends. The most popular booths were those with backdrops of the secondary school campus.





The Gala Dinner was kicked off with a captivating Chinese drum performance by the SPCC Primary School. Students in bright red and gold Chinese costumes captured every guest's attention with their energetic and well-choreographed routine, which was the perfect opening for our evening of celebration. A surprise came when Becky Lee (1995) and Derek Yeung (1989), the masters of ceremonies in the Convention Hall, suddenly said hello to the other pair of MCs in the Grand Hall – Renee So (1989) and Harry Wong

(1980), and the four of them all appeared on the screens simultaneously to interact. This was made possible by our zealous production team, headed by alumna Ingrid Leung (1990), who linked up the two banquet halls through fiber optics to showcase a simulcast of both halls and stages! According to HKCEC, we were the only secondary school in Hong Kong who had done such a celebratory arrangement in their venue so far!



After a very warm welcome speech made by Dr Philip Leong (1965), the former Chairman of the SPCC Alumni Association, we also heard from Dr Moses Cheng (1967), the Chairman of the School Council and from Dr Anissa Chan, the Principal, who both congratulated SPCC on its centennial anniversary. Then we were honoured to receive blessing from The Most Reverend Dr Paul Kwong, the Archbishop of Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui. After the singing of school hymn, the Dinner officially began after dinner grace led by School Council member Canon Ian Lam.

The highlight of the evening was the joint singing performance by the SPCC Treble Choir, the SPCC Senior Mixed Voice Choir and the SPCC Alumni Choir, with a combination of 316 performers. The halls were filled with the joyful tunes of two music room favourite pieces, *Let the Home Fires Burning* and *Come to the Fair*, conducted by Music Director Warren Lee (1994) and Senior Mixed Voice Choir conductor Apollo Wong (1997) in the Grand Hall and Convention Hall respectively.

THE CENTENARY CONCERT: A MUSICAL TREAT

Warren Lee (1994)

“Musical Treat by St. Paul’s Co-educational College: A Splendid Concert” was the heading of the review, published on South China Morning Post on 20 October 1950. It was SPCC’s first-ever public concert.

It is surreal that the same words find their rightful places in my recollection of the Centenary Concert, over six decades on. My view is of course, naturally but unashamedly biased, and I make no apology for it. I share in the joy and take pride in being a music-loving St. Paulian, both as a student years ago and as a “torch-bearing” Music Director today.

The planning for this “concert-of-the-century” went as far back as 24 months ago, when the idea of celebrating the Centenary by rejoicing in music was met with enthusiasm and unequivocal approval by the Centenary Celebrations Committee. We quickly plotted the idea of commissioning a major work to commemorate the occasion. On my wish list then was a work that could feature the orchestra as well as double choruses, so that students from both primary and secondary schools could share the stage with alumni. I also longed for a set of text that is both meaningful and relevant to our alma mater. Though there seemed to be a lot to ask for, I knew just the man I had to speak to: Mark Hayes, a good friend of mine and of SPCC’s.

Coined as the modern-day Mozart by some because of his impressive catalogue of over 1,000 choral works, Mark Hayes is a household name in the choral community all over the world, and is no stranger to the SPCC community. He had written the anthem, *I Will Lift My Eyes*, in celebration of our 95th anniversary; and also recently served as our Composer-in-

Residence in April 2014. I was thrilled, though not surprised, that my entire wish list was fulfilled in one go as the score for *Faith, Hope and Love – A Choral Triptych for Orchestra and Double Choruses* arrived in my inbox promptly on 1 September!

On the day of the concert, time seemed to zoom by quickly. Driven by the collective goal of putting on a good show worthy of the occasion, all aspects of the dress rehearsal was run with pristine efficiency. As I was quietly collecting my thoughts inside my dressing room by the stage entrance at 7:45 pm, the excitement and high spirit (accompanied by noises admittedly) of the queuing orchestra members hardly disturb my peace; instead, their cheers and nerves gave me positive vibes. “This is it, boys and girls, ladies and gentlemen!”

The opening *St. Paulian Fanfare* and School Hymn were all things “St. Paulian”. As the words, “*We build our school on Thee O Lord*” filled every corner of the Cultural Centre Concert Hall, I looked around the stage from the podium and saw alumni seated alongside students, all intensely focused in the moment. Suddenly, the word “*we*” had a deeper meaning; it gave me chills.

The Secondary School Orchestra, under the direction of Ms Carmen Koon, followed the opening act with a performance of Wagner’s Prelude to *Die Meistersinger* that had energy, drive and conviction. What became more impressive was the orchestra’s versatility to play under guest conductor, Mr Ken Lam and delivered precision and poise that were appropriate in Beethoven’s *Choral Fantasy*.

CENTENARY CELEBRATIONS



As one of the soloists in this performance, I can tell you that I felt – more than anything – a tremendous sense of pride to be a part of the school's long-standing tradition in music. Sharing the stage with current students from the Orchestra and Senior Mixed Voice Choir, as well as with fellow alumni Ken, Jennifer, Alison, Julia, Jasper, Moses and Apollo, I marvelled at how music brought us all together.

The second half opened majestically with the Primary School Orchestra. The grandeur of the occasion did not faze these young musicians one bit as they tackled Bizet's "Farandole" from *L'Arlésienne* Suite No.2 with passion and charm in equal proportion. The school-tie-and-school-badge-wearing Alumni Choir and Orchestra added yet another dimension of music as they brought a taste of French and American music, sacred and secular, to the evening. Their passion for music and dedication to making music together in the spirit of SPCC never cease to amaze me. This very sincerity and almost purity in their devotion filtered through to their performance. It spoke to our hearts.

The world premiere of Mark Haye's *Choral Triptych* was a resounding success. We were all left overpowered by the sheer beauty and harmony of the opening movement, "This is Faith", captivated by the pulsating second movement, "While I Breathe, I Hope", and heart-warmed by the touching finale, "Love Conquers All". Who could forget the angelic treble solo by Primary Five student, Zoe Yu Jinyuan who had earned herself

some autograph seekers after the concert? I can testify that every one of the 380 or so performers on stage for this piece gave their very best, both at the concert as well as in the hours of weekend rehearsals leading up to it.

Fittingly, the encores, *Keep the Home Fires Burning* and *Come to the Fair* brought the house down as these old familiar tunes rang once again in everyone's mind. At the podium, I was, by that stage, simply in a blissful state. No words could adequately convey this collective joy, shared by all on and off the stage.

After the concert and countless photos later, the adrenaline kept me awake for most of the night. Heartwarming greetings and congratulatory messages flooded in; selfies and instagrams fueled the ensuing social media frenzy. I sat wide awake in the middle of the night, and felt overwhelmingly humbled and blessed by the opportunity to experience something like this.

My most sincere gratitude goes to every one of those who devoted their time, effort and energy into making this a night for all to remember. No contribution is too small or trivial. This night is, without the shadow of a doubt, a musical treat of the highest order, for which I am convinced I am on the receiving end.

Dr Arthur Li Kwok-cheung (1961), GBS, JP, was appointed as the Chairman of the University of Hong Kong's Governing Council for a three-year term, with effect from 1 January 2016. He was formerly Vice-chancellor of the Chinese University of Hong Kong, having served the institution for two decades before being appointed as Hong Kong's Secretary for Education and Manpower in 2002.

“DESIGNING OUR CITY” EXHIBITION


On 3 October 2015, our school celebrated its Centenary in a trilogy of events, beginning with the Kick-off Ceremony early in the morning, then the inauguration of the “Designing Our City” Exhibition and finally the Secondary School Open Day, which lasted for the entire weekend.

Back in March 2014, a “Gallery Taskforce” was formed to take up the challenge of re-designing several spaces in the secondary school campus to establish the SPCC Heritage Trail and the Zhuyuetang Gallery in celebration for our school’s Centenary. The former would give SPCC students and alumni a better understanding of our alma mater’s heritage and history. The Gallery was set up to provide a place for the students to have a better understanding of arts, design and architecture, or any other subjects related to their career prospects. Indeed, it was established just in time to exemplify the contributions of our alumni in the design industry to the society. Several designers (alumni and parent volunteers) were given sections of the school interior to re-design. My husband Jason and I were most fortunate to be assigned to work on the Gallery space. Back in my school days it was a residue space where benches were stored underneath the stairs.

With the Centenary coming, the Taskforce decided to give this space a meaningful purpose and inaugurate with the “Designing Our City” exhibition.

“Designing Our City” is the first exhibition held in the newly renovated Zhuyuetang Exhibition Gallery in SPCC. The Exhibition Taskforce was formed by members from the Campus Improvement Committee and the Archive Committee, both being working committees under the School Council, to undertake the preparation and execution of this very first exhibition.

The Taskforce proposed “Architecture and Interior Design” as the main theme of this exhibition. SPCC has been well-known for its academic excellence and has groomed many outstanding designers and architects over the years. The exhibition displayed 15 award-winning projects in Hong Kong and publications by alumni, including works by renowned architects Dr Rocco Yim (1969), Dr Ronald Lu and Mr Andrew Lee (1950). Interior designers like Andre Fu (1992) and I myself also presented works. The fun part was that we were all asked to display our student photos (in SPCC school uniform) together with our projects! The exhibition




was very well-received and was definitely a popular “stopover” on the Open Day!

The “Designing Our City” Exhibition was extended to mid-February 2016 due to popular demand. After the Open Day, several discussion panels were set up by the Taskforce in the Zhuyuetang Gallery, to foster interest in the architecture and interior design industries among the students. We look forward to having more inspirational experience in the upcoming exhibitions!



In February 2015, while on vacation on the US West Coast, we paid a visit to Ms So (蘇曼如老師) at her home in Oakland, California, thanks to the thoughtful arrangements made by our classmate Julie Chan (陳亦如) (1966), Ms So's daughter, who also taught at SPCC and married a colleague Mr Edmund Tse (謝汝強老師). They are indeed a family of SPCC teachers!

Ms So was our Mathematics teacher in the 60s, and was known among us for her dry humour besides of course her astute mastery of the subject. As very well put by one of our classmates – Ms So's comments in marking our homework clearly reflected her care and attention for her students.

We had met with Ms So a few years back but had not delved much into the past, and this time we were keen to find out more. Aged 95, Ms So was lively as ever when we visited her and readily provided us with interesting details of herself and her time at SPCC and after. It was pure delight listening to her vivid account of people and events.

Ms So, often taken to be Shanghaiese, is actually Cantonese, but her father had settled in Shanghai with his family and she went to

McTyeire Girls' School in Shanghai. McTyeire was an exclusive American school boasting alumnae such as Soong Ching Ling and her sisters! She then attended the University of Hong Kong majoring in Chemistry and Mathematics, but after two years returned to Shanghai due to the Japanese occupation of Hong Kong. She finished her college education at the prestigious St. John's University.

It was at St. John's University that she befriended Mrs Tao (陶黃淑隱老師), who later also taught at SPCC and was sitting right across from Ms So in the 3/F Teachers' Room. Ms So clearly relished her memories of Mrs Tao who had a heavy Shanghaiese accent. She chuckled when she related to us funny incidents like: Whenever it rained Mrs Tao would cry “生瘡 (門窗) 啦”, and on one fine day she told Ms So that she was planning to go to Shek O “生仔 (山仔)”!

Ms So got married in 1947 and was living in Shanghai, but like many middle class Chinese in that period, moved to Hong Kong with her parents in 1949, to be joined by her husband a year later.

It was quite a coincidence that Ms So became a teacher at SPCC. In 1951 as Ms So vaguely remembered, she took up the job as a temporary teacher at St. Paul's Primary School, to substitute for Ms Wong (黃少珍老師) who was pregnant at the time and needed bed rest. After Ms Wong returned to work, Ms So stayed on to substitute for another teacher who fell ill. Eventually she was invited by then Principal Dr Catherine Woo, who noted Ms So's teaching ability, to join SPCC as a permanent member of staff, and was later transferred to the secondary section. For a while she was teaching English and Translation besides Mathematics!

Dr B. M. Kotewall, who was a few years more senior and knew Ms So when both were studying in the University of Hong Kong, took over as Principal in 1952. Ms So remembered Dr Kotewall as a very assertive educator who commanded a lot of deference from

officials in Hong Kong's Education Department. She was able to set a more vigorous academic curriculum for SPCC which deviated somewhat from the structure specified by the government – for example SPCC had fewer Physical Education but more Mathematics hours! Ms So spoke fondly of Dr Kotewall who was always supportive of her throughout her years at SPCC.

When asked about her view of SPCC students, as we knew ourselves to be far from model pupils, Ms So smiled and perhaps diplomatically declared that, while some students might be a bit naughty, all students in SPCC were courteous and good-natured, and she enjoyed teaching there. And of course, SPCC students performed very well in public examinations.

Ms So retired from SPCC in 1984 and migrated to the US. For years she had engaged in volunteer work with the “Senior Companion Programme” in the San Francisco area, visiting Chinese immigrants who needed assistance. She enjoyed helping people and continued this service until 2010 when she turned 90.

It was such a delight to visit Ms So and find her healthy and spirited. She remains independent, choosing to live by herself in a Senior Apartment although both her daughters and their families are in the US – Julie is in San Francisco and Marie (陳少如) (1973) in North Carolina, and both are visiting her every year. We take this opportunity to wish Ms So the very best in the years to come!

HARP AND MUSIC FOR ALL – AN INTERVIEW WITH MICHELLE CHOW

Michelle Chow (1986) is one of the founding members of the Friends of the Harp Limited (FOTH), a tax-exempt charity in Hong Kong. She is currently the director of FOTH. "There should not be any barrier in learning music", says Michelle. "Music is for everyone, no matter you are rich or poor."

A lawyer specialising in trust and charity law and a seasoned advisor in philanthropy, Michelle teamed up with another alumna Vivian Li (1982) and a few volunteers to establish FOTH in 2007. "FOTH had a humble start. We started as a simple shared-office operation. After we had gained more support and recognition from the public, we relocated to our current office in Wanchai, making it more accessible to students and volunteers," Michelle explains. "Harp is a beautiful instrument and yet it is falsely labelled as unreachable or just for the privileged only. Our vision is to promote the harp, to nurture passion in harp and to use music to connect people in our society."

"FOTH started off with three harps only. With generous donation from all the members in FOTH and myself, we now have over 20 harps," says Michelle. FOTH provides scholarships for students who cannot afford rental and tuition fees for harp courses. FOTH also offers harp rental service to commercial sectors, from which the income will be used to support student scholarships and harp outreach schemes. "We offer free tuition to the underprivileged students and support their practice needs. Beneficiaries include students from families who are recipients of Comprehensive Social Security Assistance Scheme, and students referred to us by the Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups or Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Welfare Council. Currently there are about 40 students benefited from our scheme and we hope to support more students with the help from the harp community and our sponsors. We also have a harp outreach programme. For instance, our harpists visited 26 outlets of SAHK in the past 12 months and we will continue with this programme in the coming year. Charitable donations are the key sources of funding for us, and we are

blessed to have received generous donations from individuals and corporate sponsors such as HSBC, who kindly put their faith in what we do."

Apart from sponsoring students in need, FOTH is also a pioneer in introducing harp to the public. FOTH organised the First Hong Kong Harp Festival in 2006, when there were only about 200 active harp students in Hong Kong. The Fifth Harp Fest co-sponsored by the Hong Kong Arts Development Council was hosted in the Piazza of the Hong Kong Cultural Centre in 2014 – an open-air display of live harp music from local amateurs, professional harpists and international guests. It was also the largest public showcase of harp display ever in Hong Kong. "With a series of concerts and seminars that lasted for more than a week, the Hong Kong Harp Festival increases the public awareness of harp and promotes passion towards harp among Hong Kong people. It also provides a platform for harp enthusiasts from all over the world to have intellectual exchange."

In 2010-2012, the Home Affairs Department of the HKSAR government offered an opportunity to FOTH to establish a social enterprise specialising in training the first-generation of local harp technicians. "We aimed to bring up harp service skills in Hong Kong so that our harp community can be served not only by overseas regulators when they come to Hong Kong, but also by local technicians who could provide more timely and attentive service. The training included overseas harp-making factory visits, personal coaching by harp makers or regulators from overseas and seasoned professional harpists," says Michelle.

In addition to FOTH, Michelle is also an avid philanthropist and

has won the Law Society of Hong Kong's Distinguished Community Service Award in three consecutive years. She is currently serving on the WiseGive steering committee at the Hong Kong Council of Social Service. She is also serving as a member of the Hospital Governing Committee of the Alice Ho Miu Ling Nethersole Hospital, an acute hospital under the Hospital Authority serving the general population in Tai Po. "My father, Chow Kun Chee Roland (1955) who is also a lawyer, is my role model. He is the one who inspired me to take the path of giving and philanthropy for the benefit of humanity," says Michelle.

Michelle noted that some SAHK* service users are persons with disabilities. They are talented but are unable to secure employment. FOTH designed a flexible programme to allow them to work while continue with their medical and therapeutic appointments. "We believe it is a win-win situation. They are highly qualified and experienced before they became physically disabled due to illness. They are keen and eager to work again. They do a good job for us while they can re-integrate into society. I would not hesitate recommending employers to consider SAHK's service users."

MY PLACE — 給孩子一個家

在2011年初，已移民澳洲的校友阮谷明 (1977) 毅然離開了工作多年的資訊科技顧問公司，到南亞遊歷兩個月。想不到這趟短短的旅程卻使一群77年畢業的校友和許多南亞小孩子的生命接上了軌。

在緬甸仰光，阮校友遇到一個牧師家庭，丈夫在當地的教會學校教書賺取每月一百五十美元的薪金。兩夫婦雖然生活艱苦，卻憑着信心收養了十三個街童。他們的居住環境非常惡劣，屋頂只用膠布蓋着，在地上挖一個洞就是廁所，孩子都吃不飽。其後，阮校友又在泰國的美索探訪了當地「聞名」的垃圾山，眼見只有六、七歲的小孩在充滿惡臭的垃圾堆中尋找廢物去變賣，內心深深的被震動了。這趟南亞之旅之後，他決心要幫助這群無助的孩子。

回港後阮校友參加中學同學的聚會，席間說起南亞的所見所聞，眾人的內心忽然火熱起來，很想為這些孩子做些事。當晚有人提議籌款幫助這些孩子，一夜之間一呼百應，在很短的時間內就通過電話、電郵等在友儕間籌集到一筆可觀的捐款，去幫助那個緬甸家庭修補他們的屋子及提供食物。然而天父的供應非我們所能

想像，在修補屋子之後，剩餘的捐款竟然還足夠在仰光開設另外一個寄住家庭，收留其他無家可歸的街童。

後來捐款越來越多，為了更妥善地處理所得的捐款，這群校友就於2012年9月成立了「My Place」，由阮校友、何德芳及黃元懋三位77年的校友負責管理，至今已經三年。有賴眾校友的熱心參與，出錢又出力，義務參與「My Place」的管理，使「My Place」的行政費用一直維持在1%以下。

至2015年，「My Place」已經在緬甸仰光開設了七個「家」，而在泰國美索則有兩個「家」，為一百一十位小孩子提供一個乾淨、安全及充滿愛的居住環境。「My Place」亦安排院舍的孩子在當地的學校上課，讓他們可以接受教育。最近，「My Place」在美索購置了一棟新的院舍，可容納七十名小孩，期望可以繼續在緬甸及泰國兩地幫助有需要的小孩，改善他們的生活。

適逢百年校慶，不知不覺我們這個凝聚校友、啓發學生的師友計劃也踏入第十五個年頭。我們在 2015 年 11 月 14 日舉行了本年度的師友計劃啓動禮，由陳黃麗娟校長以及師友計劃委員會主席吳燕安女士 (1989) 親臨主禮，盛況空前，共有超過二百五十名參與計劃的校友及同學出席。校長更訴說了自己與留學時的 Mentor 一段跨越人生不同階段的故事，發人深省。為了共同見證這一個特別的時刻，今年我們邀請了師友計劃的創始人之一——孫佩儀女士 (1974)，與大家分享當年成立計劃的初衷和宏願，以及這一路走來，箇中的心得和收穫。看似簡單的一對一交流平台，背後的功夫可不少：首先要從各行各業不同背景的校友中招募 Mentors，到為每一位參與計劃的同學挑選合適的良師，以至精心設計不同主題的活動等，一點一滴，都代表着聖保羅師兄姐對師弟妹們無微不至的關懷。

強大而親密的校友網絡一直令聖保羅引以為傲。隨着這個計劃的普及，今年共有一百六十七位 Mentors 參與，其中三十五位是今年新招募的，有不少年輕有為的校友加入，有些甚至

是當年的 Mentees！本次啓動禮既有新一代 Mentors——投身航空業多年的李嘉豪 (1996) 及企業家謝皓瑜 (1997) 分享自身經歷，以及成為 Mentors 的原因和故事；更有早年的 Mentees，現已加入 Mentors 行列的沈蔚瑄 (2002) 和蔡亦軒 (2002) 現身說法，提點同學們如何珍惜向 Mentor 取經的機會，在日後的大學、就業甚至人生的抉擇上看得更遠更高。

當然，除了經驗分享和按專業分組交流外，同學們最為雀躍的還是能第一次與自己的 Mentor 見面。今年參與計劃的校友除了來自醫學、法律及金融等傳統行業外，還按照同學們的志願和興趣增加了牙醫、教師、心理學家、科技和零售等板塊的專才，務求讓一百六十多個參與計劃的同學們在中五這個關鍵時期，可以對下一步選科及升學作出最全面的規劃。

本年度首個活動 Career Day 已經圓滿結束，我們將在餘下的學年內舉辦模擬面試、College Fair 以及職場參觀等項目，期待大家繼續支持和參與！

THANKSGIVING – CAROL SERVICE 2015

The Alumni Choir concluded an active and eventful 2015 with a joyous and heart-warming Carol Service at St John’s Cathedral on 17 December 2015.

Held just three days after the Centenary Concert, the Carol Service was attended by a considerable number of overseas alumni who returned to Hong Kong especially for the Centenary festivities, in addition to many local alumni and relatives and friends of the participants. St John’s Cathedral was filled to capacity; the atmosphere was charged with excitement and anticipation as organist, Mr Gary Tong (1997), played several tuneful preludes prior to the start of the service.

The jubilant church bells tolled precisely at 7:30 pm; Mr Ronald Kwok (1992), Master of Ceremonies, called upon the congregation to worship, with the procession of the Alumni Choir and the congregation singing *O Come All Ye Faithful* and the School Hymn. Father Wu Wai Ho (1994), an SPCC alumnus and a former teacher in the primary school, gave the congregation a warm welcome on behalf of St John’s Cathedral and invoked the presence and blessing of God with prayer. Dr Philip Leong (1965) then briefly outlined the purpose and history of the Carol Service and conveyed his warmest Christmas and New Year wishes to all present.

The theme “Thanksgiving” was chosen to match the spirit of the college’s Centenary year, and as such, two theme-related congregation hymns, *All Creatures of Our God* and *King and Now Thank We All Our God*, were added to the standard repertoire of traditional carols such as *Hark! The Herald Angels Sing* and *Joy to the World*. These ever-uplifting hymns were vivaciously accompanied by the organ and the SPCC String Orchestra.

Scriptural passages taken from *Luke 1*, *Psalms 103*, *Psalms 66* and *Philippians 4* were read by Dr Moses Cheng (1967), Dr Anissa Chan, Ms Lucilla Leung and Dr Cheung Ting Kin (1988), channelling the thoughts of the hearers to the foci of the two messages: “Giving Thanks in Prosperity” and “Giving Thanks in Adversity”. Similarly, the two anthems sung by the Alumni Choir, *Prayer of Thanksgiving* and *Rejoice in the Lord Always*, were intentionally selected to reinforce the same thoughts. The two messages were interspersed by a restful and meditative rendition of the second movement, “Sarabande”, from *Holberg Suite*, Op. 40, by Edvard Grieg, by the SPCC String Orchestra directed by Mr Daniel Chan (1987), to create mental space for the audience.

Following a lively presentation of *All Things Bright and Beautiful* by the Alumni’s Children’s Choir led by Ms Margaret Chan (1981) and the reading of the high-priestly St. Paulian Exhortation by Mr Andrew Luk (1978), the Carol Service concluded in a most festive fashion with the congregational singing of *Joy to the World* and *We Wish You a Merry Christmas*.

CAROL SERVICE 2015: SUMMARY OF MESSAGES

(i) Giving Thanks in Prosperity

Citing verses from *Psalms* 103, the Speaker exhorted the congregation to first thank God for life, good health and the freedom to worship. While celebrating the birth of Jesus, we should also give thanks for the sacrificial death of Jesus Christ for our salvation.

Referring to the autobiography of former Principal Dr Catherine Woo, the Speaker then gave many examples of divine grace that had been shed on the college throughout its long history, such as godly and faithful founders, generous donors, timely provision in lean times, miraculous protection during WWII, God-fearing leaders and committed teachers whose exemplary lives have nurtured generations of graduates characterised by humility, gentleness, a high sense of morality and responsibility, outstanding scholastic achievement, a zeal for service and a passion for music.

Lastly, the graduates were reminded to thank God for the opportunity of knowing God and his Word – the solid foundation on which our faith, hope, love and ability to discern are built.

(ii) Giving Thanks in Adversity

Quoting excerpts from *Psalms* 66 and referring to Dr Catherine Woo's autobiography once again, the Speaker urged the congregation to adopt a positive and thankful attitude in the face of adversity, for hardship and suffering might well be a God-sent opportunity for honest self-reflection, soul-cleansing and reconciliation. He told the story of Dr Woo's seven-year bout with a crippling arthritis that forced her to retire in 1952. Her disability gave her the time to travel to a retreat centre on an island in Lake Michigan, USA, where she was led to reflect on her past life. Her humble self-reflection revealed her lack of absolute unselfishness and love; and upon her genuine repentance before God and corresponding actions towards those whom she had offended, her illness was completely healed. Through her suffering, God equipped and enlarged her for a greater mission: Dr Woo totally immersed herself in the worldwide ministry of the Moral Re-armament Movement (MRA) for the rest of her life.

The Speaker concluded by encouraging the hearers to embrace adversity, for it shapes us to be more sympathetic and empathetic listeners, comforters, encouragers and healers. Trials are truly blessings-in-disguise.

們，並介紹母校的新動向。最後我們重遊音樂室一齊唱校歌，解散時大家都依依不捨，百感交雜。



昔日的合唱團歲月

是由全港中學的男聲、女聲、混聲，以及童聲組的中、英文組冠軍，相互較量以爭奪的合唱界最高殊榮。記得我參賽的幾年間，大部分時間總決賽都是由兩至三隊母校的合唱團，比併一或兩隊其他院校的隊伍（以童聲組合為多）。雖然眾決賽隊伍都是實力相當，各有所長，但聖保羅的合唱團往往能表現出極高的調和度及同步性，感情抑揚有致，讓聽眾猶如置身於歌曲的情景當中，亦因此往往能獲得評判的青睞。而最令學界津津樂道的一次，是1992年的一屆，男聲合唱團擊敗了混聲隊伍，奪得國泰盃。這在當時來說幾乎是沒可能的：一來我校的混聲合唱團是公認全學界水平最高，二來男聲缺乏女聲和唱，音效比較平面單調，先天條件吃虧。但評判認為男聲組技巧拿捏得準確之餘感情豐富，熱情洋溢，為混聲組所不及。這全歸功於我們平常建立的友誼及默契，當時每一位團員在公在私都是交情甚篤，真可謂兩肋插刀亦在所不辭。就是這份熱血、堅持、執着與忘我，把聖保羅的歌唱音樂成就，推至一個高峰。

同年，混聲合唱團獲邀於澳洲雪梨舉辦的國際音樂節表演。我們不但有幸與來自數十個國家的合唱隊伍互相切磋，更擊敗一眾包括專業團隊在內的好手，贏得了音樂節的金獎，成為可在雪梨歌劇院作閉幕表演的四隊隊伍之一。當年合唱團的水平之高，在此可見一斑。而在該次活動中，我們也認識了很多國外的歌唱愛好者，可惜因為要趕回香港出席夏季音樂會的歌劇演出排練，我未能隨隊留下作更深入的交流，實為一小遺憾。

歲月倏忽，往事已矣，昔日的光輝皆盡付笑談中。把聖保羅合唱的光榮傳統延續下去的重任，早已交到一眾學弟學妹身上。聞說近年學界比賽中眾多新貴冒起，頗有咄咄逼人之姿。而我校之傳統宿敵等，實力亦與日俱進，今非昔比，令我校腹背受敵，雄霸之勢不再。希望借此拙文，能讓同學們略窺前人精神。「天行健，君子以自強不息」，雖云萬物有時，陰陽有序，但處身立世，自我當每刻力求進步，發憤圖強，不為環境改變而動搖。願與眾合唱團學弟學妹共勉之。


