## IN CONVERSATION WITH DR CHAN: SPCC PROGRESS AND WAY FORWARD SINCE JOINING DSS

Dr Anissa Chan, Principal of SPCC

It has been 11 years, in 2002, since our alma mater joined the Direct Subsidy Scheme (DSS) which was first introduced by the Government in 1991 and modified in 1999. We recently had the wonderful opportunity to learn from Dr Anissa Chan, Principal of SPCC, on the many changes and progress of the school since joining DSS. With enhanced management freedom and autonomy in choosing the school's curriculum, setting entrance requirements, allocating of resources, and recruiting and training of faculty, our school continues its unbroken tradition of academic and music excellence and its reputation as the cradle of future leaders of both the Hong Kong and global communities.

### Student development – Introduction of IB Programme

Under DSS, Dr Chan points out, SPCC enjoys greater freedom to offer one other curriculum besides the local curriculum for students to choose. This enables the school to bring up talents with different specialties or skills that play to the strengths and interests of the students. Senior forms students are offered a

choice between the local Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education curriculum (HKDSE) and the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP), an option not available to non-DSS schools.

Students are provided with the opportunity to enroll in either curriculum based on their own assessment of interests and preferred learning styles. To help students be better equipped to make this important decision, information and career counseling service is made available to them starting at Form 2. In addition, parents are also invited to join briefing sessions to learn about the differences and offerings under HKDSE and IBDP at Form 3.

Subsidized by the government and funded by school tuition, DSS schools have more teaching resources and are authorized to make their own decisions in fund usage, allowing for more diversity in the curriculums offered. With increase resources, the school has been able to offer an expansive range of subjects and support classes with as few as five to six students. Over the last three years, such array of options and choices which caters to the students' diverse talents and interests resulted in 40 to 45 subject combinations in the DSE curriculum. As the exceptional public exam results will attest, both the HKDSE and IBDP curricula equip SPCC students with a solid foundation of knowledge and skills for university studies and lifelong learning. About 6.0% of our DSE graduates got a perfect score (5\*\*) in five or more subjects whilst only 0.1% of candidates territory-wide managed to reach that top notch. The first cohort (2013) of IB graduates earned an impressive average score of 41 (out of full score of 45) compared to the world's average of 29.8. Virtually all our graduates go on to local or overseas university of choice, including the Ivy League universities in the United States, Oxbridge in the United Kingdom, and Peking University and Tsinghua University in mainland China.

### All-round Education

In addition to the vast arrays of subject choices available to students, our school has allocated much resource to provide and support a wide spectrum of extra-curricular activities and experiential education programmes with the aim to encourage well-rounded personal growth. The opportunity to pursue their interests or specialties whether it is in the area of sports, debate, sciences, mathematics, music, art or Chinese history, fosters their overall love for learning through heightened motivation, inspiration, and creativity.





### Experiential Learning

In addition to classroom learning, strong emphasis is placed on providing students with other learning experiences where they will benefit through action/activities and the evaluation and reflection on out of classroom enrichment opportunities.

During Student Activities Week (SAW) of each academic year, students in different year levels are engaged in various activities ranging from community service, life education camp, cultural visit to Beijing and Nansha study tour on sustainable development in China. All applicable expenses including flight, accommodation and tuition for Form 1 to Form 4 are paid for by the school.

Senior form students can also participate in tertiary institution attachment programmes and business study attachment programmes. And in addition to these aforementioned school organized activities, over 40% of Form 5 students choose to engage in Self-Initiated Programmes (SIP) where they are required to demonstrate high level of creativity and independence to propose, plan and organize action oriented activities for the week.

### Rites of Passage Programme

All Form 3 students also have the opportunity to participate in a unique mandatory four-week outdoor residential programme – Rites of Passage. During this time, about 210 students in staggered groups will travel together and participate in a variety of individual and cooperative challenge activities with a view to develop not only their personal and social skills, confidence and courage to get out of their comfort zone, but also their intercultural understanding and global citizenship awareness.

### International Cultural and Social Exposure

In the increasingly international and global economic environment,

enhancing the diversity of student body and creating an enriching learning environment is an important component to maximizing students' total learning experience. Dr Chan explains that in order to help enhance students' global perspectives and international cultural and social exposures, student exchange programmes have been established with 13 sister schools in America, Australia, France, Korea, Singapore, South Africa and mainland China. Form 2 to Form 5 students can apply to participate in dormitory stay to home-stay exchanges spanning from one to six weeks and in turn, participating students' families will reciprocate and host overseas students locally. At the completion of exchange programmes, all participating students will debrief school counselors on experience and present their learning at school assembly.

The school also organizes annual international conferences in collaboration with local tertiary institutions and, with the freedom to decide what students to admit under DSS, has also established programmes to admit qualified foreign students. Greater diversity of talents and skills among learning peers will directly benefit local students in enriching the learning environment.

Needless to say, to coordinate and administer such large scale, cross border programmes require substantial resources which are made more readily available to DSS schools. Dr Chan further emphasizes, in line with SPCC's long standing commitment to provide high quality education to all its students, all fee remission scheme participants in exchange programmes will receive one-level up funding support automatically with no additional application required. For example, students receiving 50% tuition subsidy will only be required to pay 25% of applicable trip expenses which mainly consist of flight cost.

### Developing Professional Capacity

Under DSS, schools also enjoy higher level of autonomy in hiring,

training, promoting and evaluation of teachers, all of which Dr Chan emphasizes as crucial factors in maintaining high standards of teaching. Systematic staff development, appraisal and promotion policy and guidelines have been in place to encourage clear benchmark for faculty assessment and development. In addition to the keen focus on enhancing students' exposure, the school also provides generous resources towards development of profession experience and capacity. Continuous professional development (CPD) funding is available at three levels: 1. individual employees (including faculty and administrative employees) are entitled to HK\$4,000 per year subsidy to support relevant professional development; 2. department can also apply for funding support for staff to attend international conference relevant to specialized subject and finally; 3. the school also runs school-based seminars and workshops for teachers, an example of which was the series of workshops on Mastery Teaching (MT) and Cooperative Learning (CL), which are teaching strategies proven to help students achieve higher learning and better academic performance.

### Building Socially Diverse Student Bodies

With more non-government schools joining the DSS, critics continue to question whether the programme creates additional barriers, further restricting underprivileged students from seeking quality education. At SPCC, all students are admitted by merit and potential, regardless of family and social background and a quota-free fee remission programme is offered to all fee remission qualified students. All DSS schools are required by the Education Bureau to set aside a certain percentage of the school fee on fee remission (in most schools, it is 10%). At SPCC, should the need/funding on fee remission exceed the mandatory amount required, the School Council or the Charitable Trust has pledged to provide the financial resources. Furthermore, the subsidy provided by our school extends beyond tuition, as once qualified, students will be automatically subsidized any paid school activities that they take part in. And in recent years, we have also provided a bursary of

HK\$9,000 to a student's annual expense on lunches, uniforms and books.

To ensure strict confidentiality of the arrangement, not even teachers are informed or have access to the list of beneficiaries. Application vetting and approval on fee remission process is administered by independent committee consisting of a third party accountant, the Principal and the Vice Principal.

In addition, SPCC's effort to recruit students with potential extends to our Primary School. Similar to SPCC, an affirmative programme was introduced to encourage kindergarten principals to recommend students who may need a grant to attend SPCCPS. Each year, approximately 5% of incoming students are admitted under this affirmative programme. These students not only enjoy full fee remission but also receive an annual subsidy of HK\$27,400 to support their expenses in transportation, school lunches, uniforms and books.

### Looking Forward

With just two years from its 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2015, SPCC has always and continues to be committed to providing the best learning opportunities for the formation of values and attitudes, and the development of skills and competencies to its socially diverse student body. Our School Council, Dr Chan and school faculty, all enthusiastic and devoted educators, are committed to partner closely with school alumni and existing parents to provide the optimal environment to nurture our students as future leaders.

We would also like to take this opportunity to thank Dr Chan for taking the time to share with us the impressive progress and achievements of our alma mater and its students. As alumni, we cannot help but envy current day SPCC students on the vast opportunities offered to them. And, as this is the first of additional conversations, we look forward to learning and catching up with Dr Chan on other school and education related topics.

63% (85 of 134) of our students obtained level 5 or above (or A in Category C subjects) in five or more of their subjects in the DSE examination 2013. Summary of the results are as follows:

## OUR FIRST IB EXAMINATION 2013

### IB Results

1. The average score of our first cohort of IB students is 41 (out of a full score of 45), which is among the highest for schools in the world.
2. More than 80% of them (22 out of 27 students) got a score of 40 or above, compared to the world's 7%.
3. Five students got a score of 44; they are Chan Chak Ling Jenny, Lam Yu Ting Francis, Mak Hoi Kay Esther, Ngan Tze Ning and Wong Tin Wan.
4. Our mean subject grade is 6.48 (out of the highest 7), compared to the world's mean grade of 4.67.
5. All 100% of them achieved the Bilingual Diploma.

1. 100% of our first cohort IB students have either received unconditional offers of admission to leading universities in Hong Kong and around the world or met the requirements of their conditional offers of their first choice.
2. Their offers include Cambridge, Oxford, Imperial College London, LSE and the Royal Academy of Music in the UK, Cornell, UC Berkeley and UCLA in the US, as well as the leading local institutions.
3. Holder of the offer from Oxford, to read Jurisprudence (Law), has been awarded the Swire Scholarship, worth HK\$1 million over its duration.
4. Two students have been offered places in the LLB at the HKU with the screening interview waived.
5. Our students have received offers across a broad intellectual range. The programmes and courses on offer include Accounting and Finance, Actuarial Science, Biochemistry, Business, Economics, Engineering, Government and Laws, History, Hotel Management, International Business, Law, Mathematics, Medicine, Music, Natural Sciences, Pharmacy, and Veterinary Medicine.

激馮老師的。馮老師講課時在黑板上所寫的一手好字更是我難以忘懷的。後來馮老師更教我中文輸入法，這是我首次接觸中文電腦輸入法。升上中六後，馮老師雖然沒有教我，但他提拔我成為了1989年成立的中文學會其中一位創會委員。馮老師當時對我的鼓勵及教導，令我至今在工作上亦受用不少。馮健雷老師的教誨，我是不會忘記的。

離開聖保羅及移民外國後，沒有機會再與馮老師聯絡。就算後來回流香港後嘗試尋找聯絡他的方法，均不得要領。如今馮老師仙逝，我只可借校友通訊這小小篇幅及親到靈堂鞠躬，以向他表達我的敬意及對他的懷念。

這些年來，她一直在為病人服務，在香港的朋友都知道她很得病人愛戴，是醫者父母心的典型。每次見面，她都精力充沛，因為注重身體健康，日常有規律的運動，一直保持標準的體重。當我收到她突如其來的惡耗時，甚為震驚，也知道這是很難有轉機有病，決定回來給她打打氣。看到她勇敢、開朗地面對這樣的挑戰，同時亦能平靜地選擇和安排治療，盡量把自己要做的事做完。給我安慰的，是她有家人、朋友、同事和傭人的關懷和護助，也充分反映了她獨特的亮光曾照到她旁邊的人。

香港失去了一個忠心為病人服務的好醫生，我也痛失了個最好的老朋友。

### 永遠的懷念——我的摯友何勵貞醫生

我是中學才加入聖保羅男女中學，中一開始認識何勵，一直同窗至大學畢業，剛好五十五載，超越半個世紀。

記得中學放學時，我與何勵同路，當時我家離她家不遠，經常會走在一起。她母親辦的小學就在附近，何伯母是校長，每次見到她都是放學時段，她嚴肅中帶着一份無比的慈祥，站在學校門口，看着每一個學生有禮貌地、安全地離去。何勵就像她母親，溫文爾雅，不大聲說話，對人關懷備至。

大學畢業後，我們選擇了不同科目，她喜歡家庭醫學，而我則進修婦產科。何勵在政府工作一段時期後，便開始私人執業，醫務所一直設於香港仔大道。她醫術高明，何醫生的聲名很快已傳遍整個香港仔，並且被封為「香港仔皇后」，以表達她在眾多病人心中的地位。談到她的成功，醫術當然是主因；但我認為最值得向她學習的，是她的醫德，她那份絕對的責任感、那份對病人無私的愛及無窮的關懷。病中她入住養和醫院，遇到一位認識她的助護，談及何勵是她四姊妹和父母的長期家庭醫生。這位助護對我說，找何醫生看病，只診一次，便藥到病除。

我較何勵後幾年才開始私人執業。當時萬無頭緒，一切從零開始，心裏着實發慌。打電話給何勵，她快人快語，話無二句，說：「宋美，你出來開檔，我一定幫你！」就是這樣，她逐步教會我如何運作一間診所。我開業時，她還宴請我到珍寶海鮮舫吃飯，這裏全船的工作人員都認識何醫生，我們當然口福不淺。何勵行醫從不「拖症」，有需要時她會即時轉介病人。往後的日子，何勵介紹了很多病人到我診所，每次——在百忙中——她都寫來很詳細的介紹信。有時我遲了回信，她就會打電話來，問病人有沒有來，因為她記掛着，恐防病人延誤了療程。

何勵醫務工作繁忙，仍念念不忘醫學進修，並積極參與醫生學會的進修會議工作。為己為人，乃何勵一生的座右銘。何勵是虔誠的天主教徒，為了可以崇拜與醫學進修互相兼顧，她經常是星期六晚去望彌撒，因為很多醫學會議都是在星期天舉行。現今醫學發展突飛猛進，而何勵永遠保持自己在最前方的水平，也成為我在婦產科範疇外的醫學顧問。我自己、家人、朋友有甚麼不適，我第一時間就是向何勵討教，每次她都給我很詳盡的意見和實質的幫忙。我家姑姐，今年一百零二歲了，除了何醫生，她誰都不信任。每次她病倒，何醫生連中飯也不吃，就來我家替她診病、抽血和送藥。我家的訪客中，最受姑姐歡迎的就是何醫生。前幾天，她還在問，為甚麼何醫生這麼久沒來？我實在沒有勇氣向一位過百歲的老人家透露這個萬分悲痛的消息。

面對突如其來的惡疾，何勵很快就從巨大打擊中回復過來。我留意着她，就只用了一天的時間，便冷靜的開始步署一切，從容面對，勇敢投入與病魔之戰。作為一個醫生，她當然清楚血癌的治療和結果。作為一個勇敢的戰士，她也沒有忘記要戰鬥到最後一刻，帶着尊嚴平靜離去。在出入醫院治療期間，何勵爽朗的笑聲從未間止過，直到她身體變得孱弱，仍然微笑地向人揮手。末期時，她不能進食，眉頭緊皺，全身顫抖，但還是搖頭表示不辛苦。她是一個很合作的病人，不會帶給醫務人員麻煩。對於親朋戚友，也從來不會令人感到不安。

我失去一位摯友，感到無限悲痛。與此同時，我亦想到，何勵勇敢面對疾病，面對死亡，在苦難中沒有忘記照顧身邊各人的感受。既然天父已給她作了最好的安排，我們應該釋懷，讓她平靜地回到天父懷抱，得到永恆的安息，永恆的喜悅。

何勵，我們不會忘記妳，妳將永遠活在眾人心中！
