CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR 2023 COHORT OF DSE & IB GRADUATES ON THEIR EXCELLENT RESULTS AND UNIVERSITY OFFERS

HKDSE 2023

We are pleased to announce the results of our DSE graduates this year. We have two perfect scorers attaining level 5** in all four core subjects, three elective subjects and the Mathematics extended module. Two other students attained level 5** in six of their subjects and the Mathematics extended module. A total of 20 students attained level 5** in four or more of their subjects.

96.1% of our students have qualified for JUPAS degree course.

Summary of results as follows:

- No. of students: 103
- No. of level 5**: 184; 1.79 level 5** per student
- No. of level 5 or above (5**, 5*, 5): 538; 5.22 level 5 or above per student
- 95.1% of our students attained level 5 or above in English Language
- 60.2% of our students attained level 5 or above in Chinese Language
- 78.6% of our students attained level 5 or above in Mathematics
- 70.9% of our students attained level 5 or above in Liberal Studies

IBDP 2023

IB Results

- The average score of our 2023 cohort is 41.4 (out of a full score of 45).
- Of our 61 students, 2 achieved a score of 45, 13 achieved a score of 44, and 14 achieved a score of 43.
- 24.6% of our students achieved a score of 44 or above, compared to the world's 2.6%.
- 100% of students obtained a Bilingual Diploma.

UNIVERSITY OFFERS

We would like to extend our biggest congratulations to the class of 2023 for reaching new heights both within the school and beyond. SPCC continues to set a global standard, placing first in Hong Kong and seventh amongst the international school category for the number of successful offers to Oxford and Cambridge as mentioned in The Telegraph "Revealed: The schools that won the highest number of Oxbridge offers". Our university counselling team was honoured to be invited to speak on a panel with Oxford and Cambridge Admissions about best practices in high school counselling this past September. This recognition highlights the excellence of our faculty and students and reaffirms our commitment to providing world-class education.

In the UK, SPCC has broken yet another record, with the class of 2023 receiving a total of 19 Oxbridge offers. Offer holders will be going on to read Biomedical Sciences, Experimental Psychology, Psychology and Behavioural Sciences, Natural Sciences, Law, Mathematics, Chemical Engineering, Economics and Music. Two of our offer holders who will be matriculating to Cambridge are also recipients of the coveted Prince Philip Scholarship (2). We also continue to receive a strong number of offers from other highly selective institutions in the UK including Imperial College, LSE, UCL, University of Warwick and University of Manchester.

Despite the obstacles brought on by the pandemic, our students continue to show their dedication to becoming impactful class leaders, who make meaningful contributions to their communities. In the US, students received offers from Stanford University, UCLA (3), Brown University, Cornell University, University of Pennsylvania, MIT, Northwestern University (student-athlete recruit – fencing), Johns Hopkins University, Duke University, Wellesley College, New York University (2), WBB HKUST-Bocconi-USC (3) (WBB Merit Scholarship), University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, University of Virginia (Echols Scholar) and University of Washington (Seattle) amongst other prestigious institutions.

In Canada, students received offers from the University of Toronto (International Scholar Award (3) and President's Scholars of Excellence), McGill University, Western University and University of British Columbia.

Our aspiring lawyers also received excellent offers from dual degree programmes including the University of Hong Kong – UCL programme and the University of Hong Kong – Peking University programme.

SPCC alumni from various generations came together to represent their alma maters. The alumni representatives had to man their respective information booths in the school hall and the adjoining classrooms for around two and a half hours. There were 48 alumni representing 24 universities (17 from the US, five from the UK and one from each of Australia and Canada). It was an excellent forum for alumni representatives to share their university experiences with the students and for students to ask any questions they may have related to the culture, environment, life, opportunities, traditions, etc. at their target universities. Many students were very keen to get firsthand information on specific universities and degree subjects they were interested in pursuing. I personally witnessed the exceptional enthusiasm of a few Form Three students at the Oxford and Cambridge information booths when they were still asking alumni representatives intelligent questions at 9 pm that evening.

In the past few years, many SPCC students were not able to conduct university visits so easily for one reason or another. This event gave students an incredible experience where they were able to see universities through the eyes of SPCC alumni. If you ask any of the SPCC students who are going overseas for university, they will tell you that their first point of contact for believing that they can apply to a particular university was through the College Fair.

We would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to Principal Poon; Christina Gaw (1989) and Ivan Hung (1989), Co-Chairmen of the Mentor Programme Committee; Christy Liang, SPCC Counsellor of Further Studies, and her team; and all the alumni representatives for making this event such a great success. We would also like to thank Kevin Fok (2008) and Paul Yip (1998), our volunteer photographers, for taking nice photos of this event. 頌唱晚禱喚起的回憶和反思

「My soul doth magnify the Lord」不知道各位校友看到這句來自《尊主頌》(Magnificat) 的歌詞，有沒有想起當年由中學校舍出發，沿着纜車徑，再經花園道，走到聖約翰座堂參與每年一度的將臨期崇拜呢？不知道這刻在你腦海，有沒有湧現「So So So Mi Mi Do Do Fa」那個蕩氣迴腸的旋律呢？

今年3月25日，校友合唱團非常榮幸，獲香港聖公會香港島教區、崇拜生活委員會之邀，參與在聖約翰座堂舉行的《童貞女馬利亞聞報日》頌唱晚禱崇拜。頌唱晚禱(Choral Evensong)可算是聖公宗禮儀中的一份瑰寶。一些聖樂傳統悠久的教堂，如倫敦的西敏寺及聖保羅座堂，差不多每天傍晚都以晚禱崇拜來總結該日的禮儀¹。而香港的聖約翰座堂，則為東南亞地區罕有舉辦頌唱晚禱的教堂²。

教會把3月25日定為童貞女馬利亞聞報日(Annunciation of Our Lord)，目的是為了紀念天使加百列向聖母馬利亞報信(記載於路加福音第1章)，預言救主基督的降生。而《尊主頌》本身是直接取自第46至55節，童貞女馬利亞探訪另一位同時在懷孕的親戚伊利沙伯的一段。當伊利沙伯稱讚馬利亞對懷着聖子的承擔和信心，馬利亞便以這篇《尊主頌》來作回應。所以，我們在童貞女馬利亞聞報日選唱David Orr的作品《Magnificat》，實在是最合適不過³。

除了《尊主頌》，我們還獻唱了David Orr的《求主頌》、Henry Smart的《詩篇146》、Robert Lucas Pearsall的《Salve Regina》、M Praetorius的《聖母歌》、Gordon Slater的《揚頌童貞女馬利亞》，以及數篇John Sanders的啟應文樂章。當天的崇拜詩班，由校友合唱團二十一位成員組成。在指揮劉卓熙(2008)和司琴趙學文(2006)的帶領下，我們在座堂和座堂旁邊的李堂(Li Hall)一共進行了五課排練，務求在崇拜時，以最合拍、最細緻的四部和聲，表達出詩歌當中的祝福、讚美和啟示。

除了合唱團獻詩，當日的儀式還包括莫冠文會吏領禱，以及曾廣釗先生和謝承恩先生恭讀書信經課。見到不少校友、教友、小朋友和公眾人士到來參與這次頌唱晚禱，令座堂頓時充滿了信、望、愛，亦延續了去年12月Carol Service的主題「The Blessed Virgin Mary」——對馬利亞的敬佩和讚美。縱使面對「童貞成孕、懷着聖子」這個難以置信的狀況，馬利亞仍然可以憑藉信心高唱：「我心尊主為大；我靈以上帝我的救主為樂(My soul doth magnify the Lord, And my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour)³。」作為「相對」熟悉《尊主頌》的聖保羅人，我們的心有常常尊主為大嗎？我們願意在日常生活中，作出大大小小決定之前，給自己寧靜的空間去聆聽主的話語嗎？⁴讓我們一同以馬利亞為榜樣，互相共勉。



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香港耀能協會——用心家匠園景POM POM杯墊

今年6月，一眾校友攜同子女到訪香港耀能協會位於筲箕灣的會社，瞭解香港痲痺或中樞神經受創人士的生活概況，更有機會和其中一位社友交流，一家大小學習製作杯墊。

香港耀能協會成立於1960年代，鑒於當時患有腦麻痺症的兒童人數有上升趨勢，同時社會缺乏相關的配套服務和資源，一眾志同道合的專業人士便成立了香港痲痺兒童會，為耀能協會的前身。協會的服務對象多年來經不斷擴展，至今涵蓋至肢體殘障、痲痺、智障、自閉症、發展遲緩、特殊學習困難、中風及柏金遜症等患者。而其服務對象亦包括不同年齡層，從幼兒至老人，服務範圍包括教育、住宿、就業、訓練、家庭支援及社區復康等範疇，全方位照顧他們不同人生階段的復康需要。協會現每年為超過二萬五千個家庭提供服務。

活動當日，中心的負責人和導師先為各參加者介紹中心的各項設施，包括一些讓痲痺人士鍛煉身體和訓練手眼協調的設備。這些儀器設計精巧，看似簡單，但其實每個細節都考慮到用家的需要，譬如其中一部儀器的設計顧及到某些社友手腕不靈活，利用了槓桿原理，讓有肢體障礙的人士能直接用腳控制餵食工具，使他們有能力自理日常生活。

完成介紹後，中心安排了一位社友為各家庭示範製作杯墊。小小的一個杯墊製作過程原來並不簡單——從物料的剪裁以至樣板的拼合，每一步都是全人手製作，真是少一點專注和耐性都做不好。在社友細心的指示下，大小朋友都積極參與活動。各個參加者透過此工作坊，不但製作出精美的紀念品，更重要的是，大家可以通過這次機會和中心的工作人員和社友交流。其中最讓筆者難忘的是，雖然痙攣人士在某些生活上的事情有不便，但若有適當的安排和器材配合，加上他們的心思，出自他們手筆的作品比很多參加者做得還要好。大家在同一教室內，雖然背景不同，但可以互相幫助和學習。畢竟很多校友們都很幸運，擁有健康的身體。「信、望、愛」的意義不就是對身邊的人多關心、多關懷嗎？

在此特別感謝校友會籌辦是次活動，讓校友能共度歡樂的親子時光之餘，亦能讓小朋友擴闊視野，明白貢獻社會和樂於助人的重要。

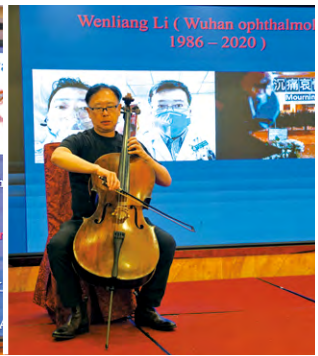

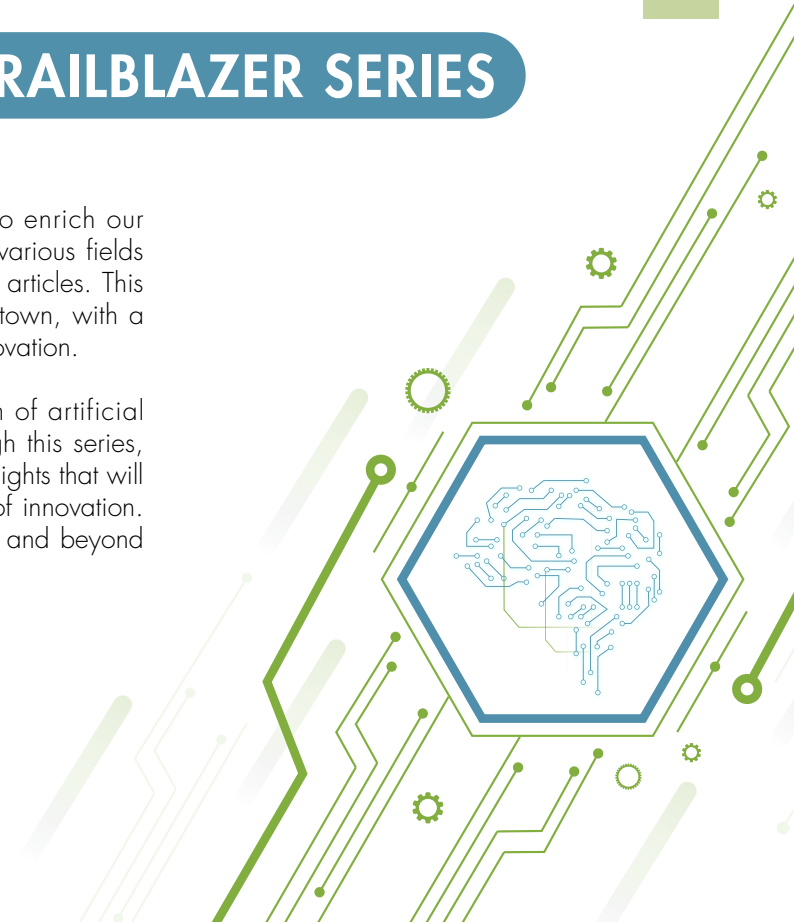

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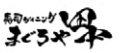

On my today's to-do list back in early April was this: compose an original work for Double Chorus and Chamber Orchestra for a premiere at the Summer Concert in July. I needed to come up with at least the vocal parts for the various choirs to learn very soon, making it impossible to commission a lyricist to come up with original lyrics. I resorted to looking online for old poems about rainbows – the theme I had in mind to symbolise the period in time we are at post-pandemic, in the hope of setting it to music. I was frustrated and disappointed that none really pleased my eyes or suited my musical needs.

One of the bookmarked sites on my browser was poe.com, which I have been using from time to time as a virtual personal assistant. I pondered asking ChatGPT to suggest poems. Better yet, I asked this assistant of mine to come up with an "original" poem about rainbows for my music. I was expecting a rather dull and generic one, unworthy of reading. But instead, a perfectly scripted and richly expressive poem appeared in seconds, which both satisfied and shocked me at the same time.

After reading the poem several times, music then flowed almost effortlessly out of my head, setting these AI-generated words to melody almost as if I too was part of this AI engine. The only problem I had was that the poem was one stanza too short for the musical structure I was constructing. Lo and behold, one extra prompt – "extend this poem by one stanza" – did the trick. I did not have to change a single word. Had this been done by a lyricist, the process would have taken at least a month, if not several.

Do I feel like I "cheated" in some way, that this work is in part generated by a machine? Not really. I feel that much of the creativity and decision-making processes still rest firmly with the creator, including choosing a name for this poem-turned-song: A Beacon of Love. AI is merely a tool – a great one as such and the importance of which will surely grow exponentially. My only dilemma now is this: who owns the copyrights to the lyrics of my song? This area of inquiry remains to be debated both in litigations and academia no doubt. I am happy to credit POE as my co-creator for now.

Will AI replace our jobs? Perhaps for certain types of jobs where AI does exceptionally well, such as writing, evidently. What is more certain is that AI will replace those who do not know how to utilise AI. Get on board!

暑期音樂會 2023

三年的疫情終於畫上句號，而學校亦於2023年7月2及3日舉辦了復常後第二次暑期音樂會。選址和去年一樣，假灣仔香港演藝學院香港賽馬會演藝劇院舉行。由於剛剛復辦，加上座位有限，暑期音樂會和去年一樣，可以說是一票難求。

可喜的是，在今次暑期音樂會，一眾合唱團團員終於可以脫下口罩表演，亦不用擔心有大量團員因受感染而臨時不能出席，真的非常感恩。

校友合唱團亦秉承聖保羅男女的音樂傳統，再次挑戰自我。我們參與第二晚的演出，這次請來廖梓丞 Jason Liu (2014) 為指揮，挑選了兩首有相當難度的樂曲。第一首是《Someday, Somewhere Over The Rainbow》。編曲的 Ernest Hui 將著名音樂劇《West Side Story》中的《Somewhere》及《The Wizard of Oz》中的《Somewhere Over The Rainbow》完美地串合起來。雖然兩首樂曲的旋律都耳熟能詳，但是這首編曲難度在於無伴奏的，而歌曲越接近尾聲，所涉及的和弦越趨複雜，這對中間聲部（即女低音及男高音）的音準要求是一個十分大的挑戰。筆者屬於男低音，雖然音符沒那麼複雜，但是整首歌基本上都要在超低音域遊走，幸好男低音部有數個筆者讀書年代男聲合唱團 Second Bass 的中流砥柱坐鎮，最後出來的效果算是十分不錯。

而第二首歌曲是布拉姆斯寫的四部混聲合唱《Four Quartette》的第一首《O schöne Nacht》（英譯 Oh Beautiful Night），歌詞是形容月色璀璨、甜蜜浪漫的夜晚。這首歌是用德文唱的，而且每一聲部都有獨唱主旋律的機會。對於大部分相對年長的團員，這首歌的難度是要重拾及表現年輕時和另一半的浪漫感覺。

音樂會的高潮，是壓軸 Grand Finale 由中學童聲合唱團、校友合唱團及中學管弦樂小組合演由音樂總監李偉安 (1994) 創作的《The Beacon of Love》。這首歌是李總監特別為是次暑期音樂會而創作的，而且還是全球首次公





開演唱。據指揮所說，這首歌是要表達三年的疫情終於過去，而我們期盼快樂美好的日子即將重臨。令觀眾印象深刻的是，歌曲的第一句是由童聲合唱團唱出的英文童謠：「Rain rain go away, come again another day...」足見李總監創作的心思細密，亦充分地表達了歌曲的寓意。沒有中學混聲合唱團的加持，男聲（尤其是男低音）只屬演出合唱團的少數族裔。筆者感受到一眾兄弟為了襯托優美的高音主旋律，都出盡百二分子力，令整首作品都受惠於深厚的根基。

實不相瞞，筆者對上一次參加聖保羅男女中學校友會合唱團的暑期音樂會演出，已要數到在尖沙咀文化中心的年代。筆者感覺到演藝學院音樂廳面積雖然較小，但是觀眾及表演者的距離近了，親切感自然多了，而兩者之間的互動性亦強了。在演出壓軸的《The Beacon of Love》時，見到家長們流露出對台上初中子女欣賞及傾慕的眼神，亦見到校董、校長、一眾聖公會牧者及校友在細心傾聽優美的旋律，令筆者突然體會到，暑期音樂會的意義除了是聖保羅師生在音樂造詣的自我挑戰，亦是與一眾聖保羅人分享音樂、以歌會友的難得機會。

筆者謹代表校友合唱團感謝聖保羅堂彭培剛法政牧師及中學潘紹慈校長，分別借出聖堂及中學 Music Room B 給我們練歌。更要多謝合唱團的一眾靈魂人物，令演出能夠順利進行。最後，不能不多謝指揮 Jason。他對我們的耐性及體諒，真的令我五體投地。就是他對我們孜孜不倦的鼓勵和指導，使我們能夠在短時間內克服高難度的挑戰。

希望來年校友合唱團除了參加暑期音樂會外，還可以舉辦更多音樂會，繼續將母校的音樂傳統發揚光大。

Testing Waters & Early Ventures That Sprouted from Their Time at SPCC

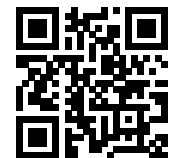

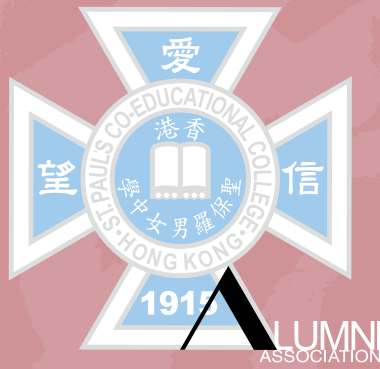
